

From Rev. Keith Bowie, Transitional Minister

This is the time of year when many folks feel, frankly, "bummed out." January is a long, cold tunnel of a month with no Christmas or Valentine's Day to soften the harshness. People can be tired and cranky. Winter, with its accompanying snow, ice, and cold, seems relentless. In the UCC we love to say, "God is still speaking..." This time of year, though, we often are doubtful of that. My hope and prayer for you, the congregation, is that you see these winter months, January and February in particular, as a time of rest and renewal. Please do what your Mama always said to do: eat your vegetables, go out and play (i.e. have fun), stay



out of trouble, visit the library/read a good book, get enough sleep, and go to church. Give someone a hug today, or hug yourself, or have someone you love hug you, and imagine that those arms are the arms of God loving you. Avoid political rancor. Political campaigning is underway for the 2024 elections. No matter what side of the political aisle you are on, both sides feel the other side is "going to hell in a hand basket," to use an old expression. Keep informed, study the issues, but if you find yourself feeling embittered or having animosity toward someone, back away.

Allow the Spirit to knit us together as one body. This brings me to church, and I have a couple of suggestions. One: greeting one another in worship and sharing coffee fellowship are great starters but volunteering your time and energy on a board or committee, choir, Welcome Table, helping out at a church supper, etc. are great ways to come to know your brothers and sisters in our church. Two: extend an invitation. Sometimes people are shy and simply want to be asked. When was the last time you invited someone to church? Three: I'm excited to announce that an updated church directory is in the works. We simply want to update the contact information (name, address, e-mail, and phone number) for every member and friend of the church. This information changes over time, and there is nothing more frustrating than trying to get in contact with someone and not having the right number or address. Details have to be worked out, but it should not be too hard to do and hopefully we can have this ready sometime in the spring. All of this is effort and time well-spent to be able to know and love one another well. Peace be with you!




