From the Moderator

In the tumult of all that has happened lately, it would be easy to presume that chaos is the order of the day. There is, however, another perspective that should attract our attention.

What if something new and different is trying to emerge from the tensions and challenges of the last several months? Are we able to be open to being reborn, to be reshaped and refocused to minister together to the world around us?

Could it be that we are being called to be our best and most faithful selves, to grow into the blessings that God has gifted us with?

I don't think that any of us are unaware of the decline of the importance of faith, church, and community in the world around us. While we all have our own perspectives on why and how this has happened, none of us would dispute its reality.

Some folks would suggest that we need do nothing about the dwindling importance of believing in God and aspiring to a life guided by an ongoing effort to be faithful. I think that both perspectives, while helping to frame the question, are only a starting point. We <u>can</u> make a difference and it <u>does</u> matter what we commit ourselves to doing. There is here in our midst, in our church family, a love that is integral to who we are. We have made the choice to treat each other and the community around us as our faith has taught us to.

We are not perfect and we most likely in this life never will be. That should not discourage us, it should inspire and challenge us. After all we have the joy of sharing the good news of the Gospel. I have come to believe that as we become willing to being open to Gods plan for all of creation, our world changes in ways that sometimes escape our notice until we are able to look back and to reflect on all that has come to be.

Part of who we are and who we might yet become is to be determined by the choices that we make. Maybe the first choice that we might consider making is the choice to be grateful to God for the many blessings that we have been given. By choosing to be grateful we might just get a glimpse of the divine. What better way to grow our ability to faithfully share Gods love for all of creation as we offer and live out our witness to the grace that is offered us through Jesus.

Let's make sharing the good news of the gospel central to who we are. Let us love extravagantly, forgive as we wish to be forgiven, expand our understanding of compassion, offer hospitality, work for justice and aspire to humility.

Let us pray that together we may labor in love to build up the body of Christ in Ellsworth and the world around us. •


