aster continues. The Resurrection is not only about Jesus being raised from the dead, but also about the continuing work that Christ performs with his disciples. Because of it, I especially love preaching during these seven Sundays in Eastertide. The Risen Christ returns to his disheartened disciples, appears to them, reveals himself, and ministers to their doubts. He let Thomas touch him, he appeared to the cowering disciples hiding behind locked doors, he cooked breakfast for them on the beach, he walked with them on the road to Emmaus and broke bread with them. Jesus is seemingly everywhere in these post-Resurrection appearances! Christ returns, coming back first to the ones who had forsaken him the most. Interesting, isn't it? The Risen Christ might have returned to Pontius Pilate or might have returned to the religious leaders, saying, "See, I told you so!" But he

did not. Instead, the accounts of Easter reveal that he returned to his disciples, pronounced "Peace be with you!", and forgave them. It is a message of forgiveness, not retribution.

You may be slow to believe in the Resurrection. Many people are. But you can't deny the fact that something amazing happened to these disciples after Jesus got done with them. They were turned upside down, a 180-degree change. How else do you explain the turnaround from despairing, fearful, and timid to confident, bold, and brave? Sometimes our gravest doubts are not that Jesus Christ is Lord but rather that Jesus Christ would call and reach out to bumbling people like us to accomplish his mission in the world. "Go, tell what you have seen and heard, make disciples of all nations, baptizing and teaching in my name," said Jesus to the very same ones who had betrayed and denied him earlier.



WHY DO WE CHANGE THE COLORS IN THE SANCTUARY?











One of the Deacons responsibilities is to assist in weekly worship, including changing the paraments on the pulpit in accordance with the liturgical year.

The season from Easter to Pentecost is also called the Great Fifty Days, a tradition inspired by the Jewish season of fifty days between Passover and Shavuot—the feast celebrating the giving of the Torah to Moses.

Instead of finding a sealed tomb, the women who had come at dawn on Sunday are surprised by an angel who announces astonishing news: "Jesus has been raised from the dead" (Matt. 28:7). The heavenly messenger invites the mourners to see the empty tomb and then go and tell the disciples that the Crucified One is alive!

The liturgical color for this season is celebratory White or Gold. When the season ends on Pentecost Sunday, White is replaced with Red. This color reminds the congregation of fire—the symbol of the Holy Spirit. On Pentecost the Holy Spirit overpowered the barriers of culture and race. The first Sunday after Pentecost celebrates the Trinity, and the color again is White or Gold.

The Deacons hope this explanation helps us understand why we use the paraments throughout the year and the meaning behind the colors. (Source: ucc.org)


Dear FCC friends,

The Ellsworth Award Program purpose is to support and offer public recognition of the contributions of businesses and organizations in and around Ellsworth. FCC's Welcome Table has been feeding the people of this area since June 2012.
