### From Rev. Keith Bowie, Transitional Minister

Pam and I thoroughly enjoyed the Organ Concert on Sunday afternoon, September 11. It made for a long day for those who attended church that morning, but most were able to get back home for a quick lunch and refresh themselves before returning in the afternoon for the concert. We missed out on the cooler weather that arrived later in the week and thus the church was a bit warm, but I didn't hear anyone complain. Many commented on how nice the steps looked as they entered the sanctuary.



The local organists that performed were excellent and collectively represented many, many years of experience in their skilled artistry and craft. I found myself wondering: How many potential future organists are in the pipeline today? I have no answer and would need to do some research on that, but it seems a lot more young people study piano than the organ. It was a pleasure to partner with Woodlawn and Kathy Young, Executive Director, who shared some amazing historical facts about the Hall pipe organ.

Friendships were made and renewed. One of the first to be seated was Rev. Ruth Martin, Pastor of the Ellsworth Falls Congregational Church. She brought a few of her parishioners with her. There was also a contingent from the Hancock church, including the Revs. Nick & Mary Angela Davis, that came out to support Debbie Riley, one of the local organists who performed. There was a large group of family seated around Peter Haynes who came to support and cheer on Peter. As you may recall, Peter's mother, Hazel, was organist and choir director in this church for many years in the 1940s and 50s. To the great delight and joy of many, there were some of our own people from First Church who had not been seen in quite a while that attended. Finally, there were some people I didn't recognize at all, but were accorded a warm welcome.

It was an afternoon well spent, I think, for those who attended and those who performed. We appreciate all the hard work of those who organized and helped to stage this event. It made the church come alive. Well done, folks!
