On Saturday, October 29, four people from First Congregational Church attended a five-hour workshop on Zoom entitled **ReLaunching Your Church** led by Rev. Paul Nickerson to help pastors and lay leaders build a customized plan to increase energy and engagement in the local church. The team attendees were Rev. Keith

Bowie, Sue Fuller, Bonnie Carter, and Leita Zeugner. About ten churches participated across the Maine Conference. One follow-up individual consultation with Paul has taken place and the first group follow-up coaching call with four other churches is scheduled for Tuesday, November 29. We will be journeying together with Paul for the next six months.

We all know the culture has radically changed, and the old attraction model of people coming to church just by opening the church door is no longer effective. Today, churches of all sizes need to meet and network with people in the community, right where they are. It's all about building relationships!

We will be introducing what we have learned and are continuing to learn in this continuing workshop with Council, lay leaders, and other groups within the church as we go forward. One of the very first things Paul has asked is that we be able to state our primary purpose as a church clearly and briefly. Why do we exist as a church? Can you do it in one sentence that is memorable and easy to share? More to come!! ◆



From Rev. Jonathan Vogel of St. Andrew Lutheran Church Helping a Ukrainian Family

This past December a long-time member of St. Andrew died leaving a \$50,000 bequest to the Church. In consultation with me, the family indicated they would like to see the majority of this used to "adopt" a Ukrainian family, potentially bringing them here to Maine and helping them begin a new chapter in their lives. We hope that this would be an intra-congregational / community effort, not only increasing our ability to provide broad resources to support this family, but also strengthening the ties within our communities.

I won't dwell on the frustrations we have initially encountered in seeking guidance and support for this work. The gist is that the need is overwhelming and any immigration into the United States is governed by both the Department of Defense and Homeland Securities. While some individuals have had success through bringing Ukrainians in through Mexico and Canada, we did not feel that it was appropriate for congregations to follow this path.

More recently, St. Andrew leaders and I have been in contact with Kasey Dillon from WelcomeNST. https://www.welcomenst.org/. With their guidance and support we have reached out to other congregations in Ellsworth and MDI. The four Episcopal congregations on MDI are now on board, as well as members and leaders of the Community in Christ Church in Ellsworth. We are hopeful that these connections will continue to expand. Another family in one of these congregations has now matched that initial gift, so we have \$100,000 in startup funds. We are currently in the process of creating an independent 501(c)(3) organization, tentatively entitled Hancock County NST (Neighborhood Support Team).

With WelcomeNST moderating, we have interviewed three Ukrainian families as possible matches. Of the two families that seem the most likely, one consists of a mother who is a physician, a 21-year-old son who teaches English and is studying in the medical field, and a 9-year-old daughter. The second family is a husband and wife with three children, ages 17, 15, and 5. With the latter, the 17-year-old son and the 15-year-old daughter are fluent in English, and several other languages. The 5-year-old daughter is already quite an artist and loves to dance.

We are currently forming a board of directors and approving bylaws. One of our (many) next steps is to create sub-committees for areas such as housing, welcome and household set up, services and benefits, employment, and, given the ages of the children, education. One of the huge challenges for this ministry will be housing in the Ellsworth or MDI areas. We hope that members of area congregations or the larger community will be willing to share their gifts and interests through serving on one of these teams.

We are very excited not only for supporting these families in need, but of the witness to our larger community of God's people coming together to serve in this ministry. Please contact us with your interest:
