From Rev. Keith Bowie, Transitional Minister

Rumaging around in my home office space recently, in an ambitious but never-ending attempt to organize, discard, and simplify, I came across a newspaper publication entitled *Ellsworth 250*, dated 2013 upon the 250th birthday celebration of the city of Ellsworth. I read some of its 65 pages with new interest and fresh eyes since I, as your transitional minister, now count myself as among those serving this community. By the way, there were a couple of great aerial pictures of the First Congregational Church and its spire included in the pictorial! However, as much as I love learning about Ellsworth's past, I found myself wondering about the future and the future of the universal church. How viable and vibrant will the church be in coming years?

This question dove-tailed with Maine Conference Minister Marisa Laviola's presentation of "Alive and Thrive" at the spring gathering of the Sunrise Association a week ago. Quoting the Isaiah 43:19 passage of scripture *"Behold, I do a new thing; do you not perceive it?"*, Rev. Laviola remains optimistic. "Connecting with the community" seems to be the trendy mantra and current panacea for re-launching the church. Whether "building relationships" will empower the church in a new age or whether we are merely re-arranging the deck chairs on the Titanic remains to be played out. Are we ready to move out into the world in Jesus' name, and make mission beyond the four walls of the church a high priority?

Breathtaking change and cultural upheaval that we are experiencing are nothing new, but "thanks" to the digital world in which we live things just seem to come at us faster today. One thing that is constant, however, is Jesus Christ "the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8). That promise reminds us that God was reliable in the past, we can trust God today, and we can hold fast to the hope that is tomorrow.

God bless each of you as we experience June's beauty and as we share the love of family and friends and the family and friendship that is our church.




Our website has a new look!
