From Rev. Keith Bowie, Transitional Minister

ur heartfelt thanks go out to the family of Eleanor Jones for their gift of \$10,000 presented to the church by Michelle Mahon during a recent worship service. As Michelle stated in her remarks, Eleanor loved the First Congregational Church, and wanted to provide a gift to the church through her estate. Eleanor died last November, and a Celebration of Life service was held at her church a couple of weeks later. Eleanor volunteered countless hours in the community and has now found one more way to be a blessing to others. Well done, good and faithful servant!

The Pastoral Search Committee has not been convened for the past couple of months due to a lack of candidate profiles. The last candidate notified the committee at the end of May that she had to withdraw her candidacy due to extenuating family circumstances. I know this has been very discouraging for the committee and the congregation alike. But I say to you, KEEP THE FAITH and continue moving forward. Something good will come out of this. It is a slow process. It requires patience and, for better or worse, waiting on God's timetable. Use this time to ask yourself: What is God nudging me to do in the life of the church? Listen to that still, small voice! Don't be negative but stay positive and stay focused. God is creative and resourceful, listens to our prayers, and brings new life.

The Choir is getting some needed rest and renewal time during the summer hiatus, and Choir Director Nancy Sargent is recuperating from knee surgery. We look forward to having the choir back among us when they reconvene in September. In the meantime, many thanks to some of our own musically gifted folks who have provided music during the summer. In July we enjoyed performances by the Monteux School musicians. David & Laura McIntyre may return in August! We also rejoice to see Anne Bancroft back in church. Anne continues her ministry of sending cards to members who are ill, shut-in, or grieving. Anne is a member of the Deacons, and we are thankful for her and the work she does. We are happy that she seems to be recovering well after her fall.

In church on Sunday, July 14, during the Pastoral Prayer, I thanked God for sparing the life of former President Donald Trump. A bullet came within an inch of ending his life. We also prayed for the family of Corey Comperatore, who was killed in the line of fire. Corey was a firefighter, family man, and church-goer. He had been given front row seats by someone else so that he could see things better. It was 43 years ago, a generation or two ago, that an assassination attempt was also made on the life of President Ronald Reagan. Many naively thought this could never happen again. Yet, tragically, it has happened again. I also prayed for a reduction of negative, divisive, campaign rhetoric. It has come down a notch but, will it last? I doubt it. Come September, this will all be forgotten. As a nation, we have a lot of soul-searching to do. Churches ought to be packed with faithful people. Don't count on that happening either. I hate to end things pessimistically, so I'll just lift up one of my favorite verses of scripture on a more hopeful note: *"Seek the Lord while he may be found, call upon him while he is near; let the wicked forsake their way, and the unrighteousness their thoughts; let them return to the Lord, that he may have mercy on them, and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon." - Isaiah 55:6-7*

How are you doing with that To Do list? Is your email box full? How many social media apps are you looking at? Is your mind whirling even when you try to relax?

The pace of life we keep can often be exhausting and can lead to a constant, hurried state. John Ortberg, in his book, **Soul Keeping**, talks about how when we are hurried all the time, we cannot be fully present to others, and we become unavailable to God. Summer is a great time to slow the "*hurry*" of life and reconnect with God. Here are a few suggestions to get you started:

- If you have been neglecting your devotional life, try carving out even 5 minutes to just breathe and be with God.
- Take a walk and get in touch with nature again.
- Make a list of ways you are blessed and give thanks to God.
- Have a "fast" from social media or email for a day (or even a couple of hours) and see how much time you gain back to renew.
- Call up that friend or relative you have been meaning to talk to and just listen to them.
- Do a craft, sport, or hobby; something you can lose yourself in, letting go of the To Do list for a while.

Whether you are a pastor or a lay person, the most important gift you can give your church is a centered you. Your gift of being present for God and for others is critical to the health of your church.

ONA CONVERSATIONS

From the purpose statement of First Congregational Church of Ellsworth: we "...strive to build on commonalities while seeking to understand, accept, and celebrate our differences."

During the annual meeting last January, the congregation gave its approval to explore and learn more about what Open and Affirming (ONA) means. A committee was formed and has been working on this charge.

As part of our deliberations, we have felt that most people seem to be comfortable with the definitions of discrimination based on age, race, national origin, mental and physical ability, to name a few. However, some may have difficulty with what it means to discriminate based on sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression, especially as it relates to our faith community.
