

IT IS ADVENT! The writings of prophets, psalmists, and evangelists join the lighting of candles, singing of hymns, and prayers of the faithful in bold proclamation: **Awake! Our Lord Comes!**

Please join us at the First Congregational Church during Advent in December. For these four Sundays, we will eagerly anticipate the gift that is ours in Jesus Christ. On the first Sunday of Advent, we light the candle of **HOPE** (December 1), followed by the candle of **PEACE** (December 8), the candle of **JOY** (December 15), and the candle of **LOVE** (December 22). We will hold our traditional Christmas Eve candlelight service at 7:00 pm. We will be joined, again this year, by our friends David & Laura McIntyre, as they present (and invite us to sing along) beautiful Christmas songs and music. You do not want to miss this service!

In the meantime, we wait with expectant hope and anticipation. We wait with delight and gratitude, treasuring within the still and silent crevices of our hearts the hope that

grows for the One whose grace sustains us. During this Advent season, we must not let the Christmas story be so familiar that we gloss over its enduring significance. Our hearts should not be so jaded by the chaos around us that we fail to embrace the message of the angel: "I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people; to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior..." When our delight is in the Lord Jesus, who is the same yesterday, today, and forever (Hebrews 13:8), then our joy can be anchored in something other than our immediate circumstances and the world around us. Let us thank God for Jesus!

Why Advent is so important this year.

At the time of the birth of Jesus, it was a cruel world. The Roman Empire ruled with brutal force. The religious establishment turned its back on much of the population. Finding food and shelter was often a daily struggle and if you had an infirmity or were a widow, you lived on the edge. And into this difficult time came the Light of the World. Is it any wonder that so many people flocked to Jesus to hear the Good News that they mattered, that they were sons and daughters of God?

We come into Advent 2024 in the midst of lots of turmoil as well. Regardless of how you voted, we all have felt the weariness of nasty politics and more media coverage in more forms than any of us can handle. There are ongoing wars, global warming, continued racism, well you get the picture. We are all hurting and anxious about what the future holds.

We need to celebrate again the coming of the Son of God. And not just us church folk but so many beyond our congregation. Think of how many people in your community are struggling right now. Think of how many are lonely and isolated. Think of how many need an encour-aging Word right now.

So, please think and pray about one person you know that you could invite this Advent. We all

need to hear the Story again, to sing the carols and light the candles and remember that the darkness could not stop the Light. We need Advent right now and so do so many who have never been to our churches. Invite someone, pick them up and walk in the door with them. Together, this Advent, we can let go of the fear, the anger, the hurt of this world and remember again Whose we are. The best gift you can give this Christmas season is an invitation to someone you know. ◆

More from Rev. Paul Nickerson: "The Two Greatest Assets Your Church Has"

I often hear churches talk about what they "*don't have*": not enough people, not enough money, etc. But I would like to focus on two great strengths every church has.

First, every church, large and small, has a core of dedicated leaders. I am so impressed with how much time, energy and faith leaders give to their churches, often over many decades. This is a great asset that should not be overlooked. Help those leaders use their gifts and talents and point them to the most important things God is calling you to do. We have inherited our church communities from generations of people who faithfully served and we have similarly dedicated people today. Don't underestimate this invaluable strength.

Second, and most importantly, we have the gift of the Holy Spirit. As a Coach, I have the great honor and privilege of witnessing how a dedicated group of people can do amazing things when listening to and following God's lead. We don't run human organizations; we lead a group of followers who are inspired and motivated by God's vision and Spirit. Mark Batterson said that when we in the church try to accomplish something, it can only happen when God is in the midst of it, then God has us right where God wants us.

The best efforts of your core leaders, energized by the Holy Spirit, is an unbeatable combination. Whatever your current church situation, you have two great assets to make a difference.

Go and build God's Kingdom. You and the Spirit can do this.
