From Rev. Keith Bowie, Transitional Minister

ne of the more interesting responses that came back from the worship survey that was conducted back in March was this gem: "It would be a good thing to be more visible in the community, somehow. I really believe that FCC is the best-kept secret in Ellsworth. Many people just don't know what lies behind the church doors, the exception being church suppers."

Now I honestly don't know who penned this revelation since it was an "anonymous" response, but the anonymity of the author is of no concern to me. What grabbed my attention is that the thrust of the insight is both laudatory as well as a challenge. "Best-kept secret " refers to something very good or valuable that is not widely known. It implies that the secret is not widely shared. It suggests that there is a limited circle of people who know about it.

God has brought together at First Congregational Church (FCC) some very amazing, talented, compassionate, and faithful people who time after time have done good work and have responded to the needs of others. God knows the difference you have made in the lives of others. My deep appreciation and thanks go out to those who are contributing to the upbuilding of this church. The challenge, of course, as reflected in the above comment, is that this good word and work is not getting out into the community. The old adage that "bad news travels twice as fast as good news" applies here.

Jesus has an applicable word for us, in his Sermon on the Mount: "You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lamp stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5: 14-16).

Yes, God knows the difference we make in the lives of others, but do others in the community know? Are we letting our light "shine before others"? Wouldn't it make a difference in the life of our church and in the community if we did? Let's work on this...together!

Saturday, June 28, 2025 Serving 5:00 to 6:30 pm




Roast pork, mashed potatoes, glazed carrots, green beans, salad, rolls, homemade pies, and beverages (coffee, tea, lemonade)
