Flicker Wild Church

How does the UCC support emerging ministries? The Strengthen the Church Offering is a source of funding for Congregational Assessment, Support, and Advancement Grants. One of these grants helped support the new ministry of Flicker Wild Church.

The Rev. Daniel Cooperrider has always had a passion for connecting spirituality and nature. After watching churches during the pandemic years experiment with how to worship outside the context of the church building, he recognized that others shared a hunger for outdoor, nature-based spiritual community. Alongside his spouse, the Rev. Dr. Julia Burkey, Cooperrider responded to the Spirit's call and decided to invite others to join in this yearning. On the Fall equinox in 2023, Flicker Wild Church gathered for the first time.

This community, found in various outdoor landscapes outside of Madison, Wisconsin, embraces the expansiveness of God's presence in creation, and the movement of Spirit in the movement of the seasons. Scripture, poetry, movement, meditation, and song ground their worship practices, with a "wild wander" in place of the sermon. Flicker Wild Church's invitation to worship not just in nature, but with nature and to be in spiritual relationship with the more-than-human world has offered hospitality to those who might be unlikely to step into a traditional church building. Your support of the Strengthen the Church offering equips leaders, funds new churches, and fosters innovation. The offering is a celebration of who we are as church together, as money is shared between the National ministries of the United Church of Christ as well as with Conference settings.
