POLISHING UP YOUR HOSPITALITY MINISTRY

As the new church year begins, it is a great time to update and fine-tune your first-time guest hospitality ministry. The first impression you make on a guest can be the difference between someone deciding church isn't for them, or the start of a journey of faith.

So here are a few "Tune-Up" reminders:

- **Greeters:** With signage, point guests to the door you want them to enter and have a greeter outside the door, weather permitting. This is a very welcoming gesture.
- Information Table: Have a well-marked information table to assist first-time guests. This will help with interior directions, kids' needs, etc. It is also an opportunity to get contact information.
- Ushers and choir: Make sure ushers greet well and assist people as needed. If you have a choir, consider having rehearsals end early enough so they can be out in the sanctuary engaging people.
- Worship Service: Be certain that the bulletin is easy for a first-time worshipper to follow along. Watch how many "in-house" announcements happen and have the worship leader offer a warm greeting.

- **After worship:** All of the above people are back on duty helping, starting conversations and thanking people for attending.
- **Follow Up:** A prompt thank you note, email, or text is greatly appreciated by a guest.

These are some key hospitality activities that really make a difference. And finally, the very best hospitality tip is to INVITE AND BRING SOMEONE WITH YOU! ◆



Big changes happening at the Pilgrim Lodge campus

Perhaps you've heard. The Conference Office is moving to the Pilgrim Lodge campus in Fall of 2026! The Maine Conference Board of Directors decided to renovate the old Farmhouse at Pilgrim Lodge for administrative use. This investment in our own property will free us of \$36,000 a year in rent (!) and provide us with space for all our staff to work together year-round.

We have begun the work thanks to the proceeds of the sale of the Sebago Land Sale last year. To complete the project, we need to build together! Our covenant invites us all to share the joys and burdens of being the Maine Conference.

Proceeds from the land sale are to be used for demolition and construction. We need donations for the interior work that includes items as well as infrastructure. We are inviting you to partner with us in a capital campaign to build for the future of the Maine Conference.

One Vision. One Mission. One Home.

Our goal is to raise \$150,000 in monetary gifts or physical items. We know we can do this, because "In Covenant, we build together."
